Perishable matter should be so indicated on the outside of the package which should be plainly and completely addressed so that there can be no possibility of confusion. A return address should be placed in the upper left hand corner of the package. Postage must be fully prepaid on all mail.

Mailing Day and Weight

No parcel may be more than 84 inches in length and girth combined. "During the holiday time," Mr. Cobb said, "the volume of mail increases approximately 200 per cent. It is a physical impossibility to handle this great mass of mail prior efficiently and promptly within a few days. Therefore, to assure delivery of their Christmas presents, cards and letters by SHOP AND MAIL EARLY."

Patrons sending a quantity of Christmas cards should prepare and mail them two or three weeks in advance because millions are mailed and can not possibly be promptly delivered if mailed only three or four days before Christmas. The use of a special delivery stamp will assure delivery on Christmas Day if mailed at the proper time. When the words "Special Delivery" must be written on the stamps. Uninsured orders of eight ounces or less may be mailed at the ordinary street letter or package boxes, at all classified stations and branches and at the main post office. Written matter in the nature of personal correspondence can not be enclosed in parcels.

While the original turkey dinner was of turkey and simple vegetables the modern dinner approaches the elaborate banquet characteristic of a prosperous nation. Statistics gathered haphazardly from government and local reports show that the amount of turkey consumed in America on tomorrow will be the filling. And there will be the usual busy doctors and increasing sales of medicines at drug stores.

The edible nut industry, for instance, has been doing a bigger business this year than in many previous years. Most of the walnut supply, surprising as it may seem, comes from France, most of the filberts from Turkey, most of the almonds from Spain and the bulk of the Brazilian nuts from Brazil, Italy, China, Rumania, Morocco, Germany and Great Britain also contribute to the American festival. America's consumption of edible nuts, exclusive of what is exported, amounts to 956,000,000 pounds!

Hundreds of tons of turkey will be over the main section in the larger communities of the country. In Birmingham the price is about 10 pound for fresh young gobblers and the birds weigh from six to 20 pounds.

Millions of bushels of cranberries, potatoes, apples, carrots, squash, celery and candy and numerous other delicacies will be consumed. While turkey is the traditional fowl for the feast, many hunters who have returned recently from the woods in Northern Michigan will provide their duck, rabbit and pheasant.

we later desire to build elevated lines. He says that grade crossings will slow traffic but that seems to me unreasonable as it would only mean a couple of stops in 25 miles.

"This clause provides only for a crossing with a roadway. We should also cross with street cars because about 35 per cent of the people in the city cross the city every day and we have 1,500,000 people in Detroit."

Mr. Oakman also questioned the councilmen about the tax on the highway and expressed his belief that the tax should be under the railway acts or the interstate commerce commission.

Who Runs the Road?

Then he asked with characteristic emphasis: "Who is going to run this highway? Is it going to be a railroad matter? Let Mr. Bower tell us what corporation is behind this project."

Earlier in the session the councilmen discussed his contract with the Grand Trunk railway which permits him to build a highway at night-of-way. It had been explained by Wilcox that city officials had not seen voted to instruct the city clerk to ask that it be filed with the city.

The city's right to cross Bower's highway at grades brought lengthy discussion. Last week Bower objected that street cars on the grounds that traffic would be hampered by such crossings.

Bower stated that in the contract was building "a speedway and grade crossings would defeat the purpose of the project." He added that he did not object to the city building crossings above or beneath the highway.

Need Only a Few

Councilman Bradley declared should have as few grade crossings as possible. He pointed out that these crossings were delayed at such separations.

Councilman Littlefield, following the proposal offered by Wilcox for two grade crossings, the rest to be determined by a board of arbitration, said, "We've got to get the right in the contract now. We can't leave it to a board of arbitration. Why, we would have a leg to stand on. Any board would rule against grade crossings, so we might as well get them now."

Councilman Walters proposed that a commission set the fares, instead of leaving it to the state utilities commission. "Wilcox pointed out that the law already provides for a fare, based upon a fair and reasonable return on the investment." Walters, however, suggested that commission composed of representatives of all the communities through which the highway passed should regulate them. "We have commissions on street railways and public lighting, why not on a motor highway?" he asked.

Councilmen Nagel, Callahan and Dingeman agreed with Bradley when he said he did not believe the city should contemplate grade crossings. "Many clauses in the proposed contract were referred back to Wilcox to work out with Bower's attorneys."

We must have in the not too distant future, a highway where the present Grand Trunk tracks and with that development we must necessarily cut a large gash through the village. Some study should be given to the beautification of this highway through our village and an effort made to have some plan adopted by the State Highway Department toward this end.

At present our storage facilities are too widely scattered and inadequate. Some of the municipal materials have to be stored outdoors when they should be properly housed.

A single unit with adequate preparation and plans for the future of the village would reduce expenses of the department and some duplication of work.

Because the people have not been properly informed of the purposes and advantages of an improved warehouse and housing quarters, little has been done to advance the proposed plan. We hope that a more evident civic interest will be taken in the bond issue which will provide for the numerous improvements along this line when it comes before the voters in the spring.
