BALDWIN FIVE OPENS SEASON IN DEARBORN

Coach Engel Starts Basketball Practice For Game Scheduled Dec. 6

SQUAD INEXPERIENCED

Final practice for the opening game of the season with Dearborn High School basketball team on December 6 is expected to get under way by the end of this week when the Baldwin High football season closes. Many of the fourteen are members of the football team and are not allowed to take part in basketball until the grid year is over.

After that time Coach Ernest Engel hopes to increase the membership of the present squad by 20. The men at present are the same as last year, with the exception of Capt. Hartwell Ladd and a few others who played last year.

The opening game will be played on the opponent's floor at Dearborn. Severe competition is expected and the Maroons will have plenty on their hands after the opening whistle. Coach Engel is uncertain as to who will fill the places on the squad and probably will not know until shortly before the tilt.

As soon as the season is well under way Coach Engel will cut the squad to 12 men and organize class teams. Members of the regular team will not be eligible for the inter-class teams. This step will be certain to produce for the first team in future years and will furnish material for practice encounters for the regulars.

Hard Practice Scheduled

Each Engel will put the men through grilling tests to get the fair shape for the first game. From the standpoint of the appearance of the players at the present time, Coach Engel continues to be doubtful as to the possibilities of producing a winning team this year but expects to round the men into good shape before the season is well under way. The team weakened this year by the loss of many of the star players through graduation. Many of the second year members of last year are being trained for emergency places on the team. There are very few new members out for teams are expected to extend the list of names on the membership list.

ADAMS CAGERS BEGIN TRAINING

Coach Wiseman Puts Squad Through Intensive Workouts

With but slightly more than a week in which to practice for the first basketball game of the season, the Adams Junior High School squad will go through its first training session, under the direction of Coach Wiseman.

The Adams team has a hard season ahead of it and Coach Wiseman will soon begin strenuous practice in order to have his players in shape for the opening encounter with Baldwin Junior High School on the Adams floor December 13.

Last year the Adams School had a first class team but, like the Baldwin High School team, is weakened this year by the loss of many star players through graduation. Only one player appeared on the final list of last season's team and that was a loss to Berkeley, the weakest team in the league at that time.

The loss was decidedly the result of overconfidence against which Coach Wiseman fought but to no avail. During the first of the season the Adams team swept like a whirlwind, defeating each team that opposed it and the over-confidence crept in and the team soon met defeat.

Few Practices Held

Coach Wiseman has plenty of material with which to work but the majority of the men are inexperienced and have hardly any practice at the game. In a practice contest with the alumni last week, Coach Wiseman's team held the winning side of the score but played sluggishly. Many of the faults have since been corrected and Coach Wiseman will begin now out for the winter sport and are being trained for emergency places on the team. There is much to do concerning positions on the team. Coach Wiseman has said that the best man takes the place, regardless of previous standing. This statement will incite keener competition among the members of the squad.

The squad will go through the longest and hardest practice sessions next week in preparation for the first game. Nightly practices were inaugurated last week and will continue throughout the season.
