Remember that the use of kerosene for starting or quickening a fire is dangerous. Countless homes are destroyed, and many lives are lost every year, from this very cause. DONT take chances!

Guard Stoves Dont fail to place metal protection under all stoves (extending at least eighteen inches in front and behind the stove) where stoves or furnaces, or smoke-pipes are close to walls or partitions. The open flames and fire provide screens for open fire-pipes. Do not hang clothing or bags near stoves, or on stove-pipes or steam-pipes.

Hidden Stoves Dont fail to have all smoke-pipes and chimneys inspected, cleaned and repaired by a competent person before the start of the winter. Defective flues are prolific fire causes mostly in homes. Unused stove openings in chimneys should be bricked up or covered with light metal cap. Dont ever use a pipe or a flue-hole with paper or wood.

Watch Pilot Light Avoid leaving portable electric heating devices unattended. Disconnect same or pull the plug after using. Pilot lights should be installed and used with such devices. Dont fail to take precautions with electric smoothing irons. Be careless use of such very common and widely used household appliance causes an average of thirty-five fires every day, most of which are in homes.

Match-Smoking Dont throw away lighted matches, cigars or cigarettes. Be sure they are "cold." The cause of "Match-Smoking" burned up Twenty-nine Million Dollars worth of property in the United States in the year 1923. To smoke in garages, or in bed, or in the kitchen, is to invite disaster. Deliberately to invite disaster is to jeopardize the lives of yourself and family at Christmas-time by using cotton for trimming the children's Christmas tree, or for making imitation hair or Santa Claus whiskers. Use asbestos or mineral wool instead of cotton. Use time and glass instead of paper garlands. Dont use candles on Christmas trees. This dangerous practice cost the lives of thirteen people in One fire on Christmas Eve, 1924.
