

VIOLATIONS FEW IN MONTH

A marked decrease in the number of law violators appearing before Justice Floyd S. Buck is shown in the report for September with 101 cases reported against 179 of the preceding month.

The great decrease in the number of speeders is shown with September's report showing 35 persons appearing on this count, while August's books showed 64. All speeding arrests were made in the village with fines totaling \$810.

Village arrests appearing before Buck paid a total of \$920, against last month's \$779. Three persons paid fines of \$100 each on drunk driving counts, and a fourth is serving a 60 day sentence in Oakland County jail. One person is serving a 30 day term on a disorderly charge and two others paid fines of \$35 each.

The number of disorderlies arrested in the Hills also showed a drop with 27 persons arrested on that count in September against 37 of August. Disorderly fines totaled \$1,135.00 with one person

serving a 60 day term and another a 15 day sentence. Five persons were arrested in the Hills on reckless driving charges, paying fines totaling \$130. Hills arrests totaled 34 against 51 of August.

Nine persons arrested in the county are serving 15 day jail sentences in Oakland County jail on disorderly charges. Fines on this count totaled \$150. Thirteen persons arrested in the county appeared before Buck on reckless driving charges, paying fines amounting to \$230.

Many Nations Enlist Red Cross

Membership in Oakland Chapter, American Red Cross, must membership in a national and international organization. This aspect of Red Cross was pointed out today by Miss Carrie M. Taylor, executive secretary, in connection with Oakland chapter's 1930 roll call.

World unity for this organized service was effected at the 11th International Red Cross Conference on Oct. 24, 1928.

The Red Cross now has 21,000,000 members in 60 countries of the world. There are 3,500 chapters in the United States. The chapter leaders are outstanding men and women from groups representing every walk of life.

What is true in America, also is true in other lands. The Red Cross membership in Japan at present exceeds 2,500,000 or four per cent of the entire population, an even higher percentage of membership than in the United States.

Indicative of the services of the national societies generally, the Norwegian Red Cross maintains a hospital ship on northern fishing seas; Sweden, cottage hospitals in sparsely settled sections, as well as airplane ambulance service. Red Cross nurses are being trained by 24 countries and Siamese Red Cross maintains bacteriological and serum laboratories.
