A charge of involuntary manslaughter was placed against him when deputies declared after an investigation that the truck was parked without lights.

Driver of the car, Ray A. Thompson, 35 years old, 1373 South Riverside drive, St. Clair died shortly after his arrival at Highland Park General Hospital.

Deputy Floyd Stapleton, who investigated the accident, said that the truck had no lights.

After glancing from the side of the gravel laden truck, the roadster hit a car driven by William J. Hankster, 2422 Farrar avenue, Highland Park, in which Slankster's wife, Marguerite, was a passenger. Both were badly cut by flying glass.


