"Kibitzer," a character comedy with George Sidney starred in the title role, is at the Cass Theatre, Detroit.

"Kibitzer" was one of the outstanding comedy hits last season in New York where it played for several months at the Royale Theatre. It came to Detroit from Chicago after playing at the Woods Theatre for more than two months.

A kibitzer, in the sense generally used, is the "buttniky" in a card game; a man who watches the game and offers advice or finds fault. The authors of the play Jo Swerling, a former Chicago newspaper man, and Edw. G. Robinson, however, have used the word in a broader sense—a person who specializes in criticism and advice but who is worthy of participation in any activity, be it pinocchio, prize-fighting, politics, the stock market, or anything else.

George Sidney, who stars in the play, will be particularly remembered for his splendid work in five years, and for his screen appearance in the "Patsch and Perlmutter" and "The Cohens and the Kellys" series. This will be his first stage appearance in four years, having left the screen for a year or two because of the unrest in moving picture circles due to the activities of the Actors Equity.
