MAN RESCUED FROM CAVE-IN BY FIREMEN

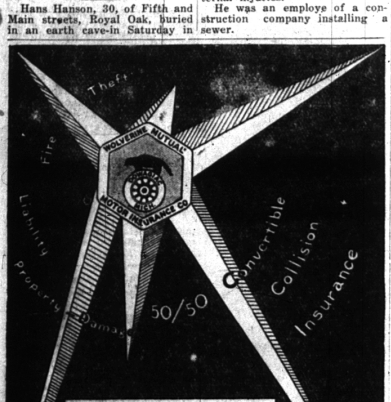
Birmingham, is reported improved at the St. Joseph Mercy Hospital, Pontiac, today.

OAKLAND COUNTY NEWS

James LaRue, 26 years old, 269 West 11-Mile road, Royal Oak, must stand trial in circuit court, on a charge of involuntary manslaughter resulting from the death of two men who drove their automobile into his unlighted truck, Justice Henry W. Harpster ruled recently following an examination in municipal court, Pontiac.

Buildings of a modern type will replace those swept by flames in two recent disastrous fires in Milford village.

By a majority of 52 votes, electors of the Clarkson school district on Oct. 16th, approved a bond issue totalling \$150,000, with which to erect a new school to care for high school and grade groups, as well as provide a community room and other features.

About 200 telephone circuits in Royal Oak Township were put out of order as the result of the windstorm last week. Swaying trees severed some of the large telephone cables, and dislodged others from the poles.

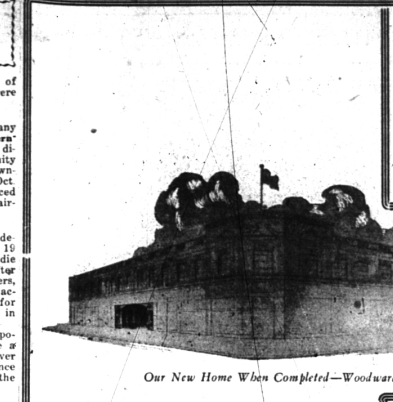
