VILLAGERS WARNED AGAINST NEW SWINDLE INVOLVING CARD SALE

Warning against a new form of racket which emanates in Jerusalem is given Birmingham residents today by the office of the Secretary of State, United States Government. A village man, who asked that his name be withheld, forwarded to the department a request for information as to the contents of an "appeal" made by a woman in Palestine. The department letter brands it as a racket. The appeal is for the purchase of "flower greeting cards." The letter from the Department of State follows:

In reply you are informed that the Department has received several letters from persons in the United States transmitting copies of the above mentioned form letter. The Department requested the American Consulate General at Jerusalem, Palestine, to make inquiries concerning the writers of the letters and several dispatches have been received from the Consulate General on this subject. Copies of the Consulate General's despatches were forwarded to the Postmaster General for such action as might be deemed appropriate.

Inquiries Made

The Consulate General at Jerusalem made inquiries concerning the origin of the letters which were being sent to persons in the United States and it was ascertained that the writer of the form letter, Miss Ch. R. Cohen, is the daughter of Mr. David Cohen Kaplan. It appears that Mr. Kaplan and his family of five children have for several years

One Child At Home

Two of the children are living in South Africa, the oldest daughter is married and resides with her husband and two children in Tel-Aviv, the youngest daughter only lives with her father in Jerusalem, while the fifth child Zvia, who is about 22 years old, is employed by the Bonded Warehouse Company of Jaffa and lives alone in a room rented from a private family in Tel-Aviv, a Jewish suburb of Jaffa.

Owing to the questionable character of the children's solicitations they were warned that if they continued along the same lines in the future their correspondence would, in all probability, be excluded from the United States mails. It would appear, therefore, that it is now their desire to join one or several American national organizations for the purpose of conducting the sales of their flower cards among the members of those organizations in the same manner as that employed by the father.

A copy of your letter, together with a copy of the form letter, has been forwarded to the Postmaster General for such action as may be deemed appropriate and inquiry has been made as to whether he considers these solicitations for funds should be barred from entering the United States mails.

An instruction is also being sent to the American Consul General at Jerusalem, transmitting copies of your communication and the form letter for his information in this connection.
