

MANY TRIALS WATCHED BY BIRMINGHAM

Run For Mayor



Cases of Interest to Villagers On Crowded Circuit Court Docket

BALKO SUIT IN OCT.

Opening of the September term of circuit court this week will bring several cases to trial in which Birmingham residents are interested.

The false arrest suit filed by Mrs. Marion Balko, widow of Walter Balko, of Birmingham, against police officers, is on the docket and will probably be heard in November. It is indicated Mrs. Balko charges Sheriff Frank Schram, Deputies Joseph Robitaille and Bernard Schrader and Patrolman Joseph Metzger with mistreating her when she was arrested and held three days after her husband had been slain near Birmingham. She asks \$50,000.



Andrew Germano and Lawrence McMillen will be tried on charges of assault with intent to kill growing out of the shooting April 16 of Patrolman Henry Millibrant in Birmingham.

Thomas Gordon, formerly of Birmingham, will be tried on a charge of violating the prohibition law.

William Borycz and Casmere Halman, charged with robbery in connection with the hold-up of the Detroit Edison company's office in Pontiac and the subsequent running gun fight with police in Birmingham will be one of the early cases.

On the most crowded criminal dockets in the county, the case of the people versus Charles Cross, former Oakland County sheriff, charged with murder, is expected to attract wide attention. The Cross trial is expected to start this month.
