Serve Salad Instead Of Hot Meat

JELLIED LAMB SALAD

(Mrs. Mary Morton's Weekly Tested Recipe)
Chop cooked lamb fine or cut it in small cubes. To each two cups of it add salt, pepper, paprika, onion juice, and a dash celery salt. Dissolve one tablespoon gelatin in cold water, add one cup raw, finely chopped spinach and one cup boiling water, and let it all stand until the gelatin is dissolved and liquid colored green. Strain. Add it to one cup mint sauce, and the seasoned chopped meat. Pour into a bread pan to mold, or into individual molds, and when set, serve on lettuce with mayonnaise dressing with a bit of mint jelly atop it.

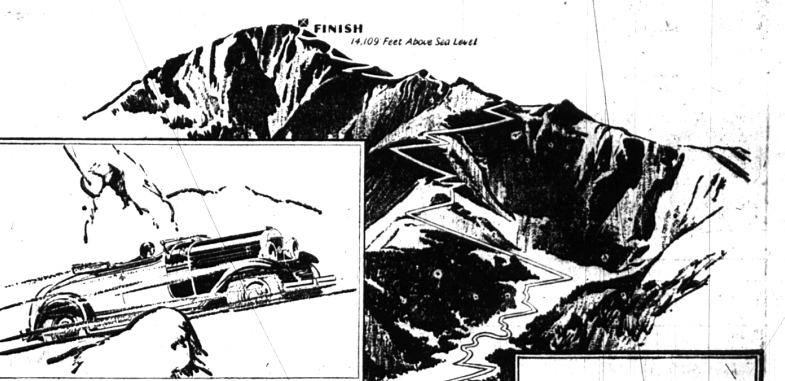
