(Continued from Page 4, Part 3) School District No. 1 Fractional Townships of Bloomfield, Troy, Royal Oak and Southfield duly called and held on June 15, 1929, more than a majority of the qualified voters present voted in favor of the proposition of borrowing the sum of \$35,000.00 and issuing the bonds of the School District therefor for the purpose of building and equipping a swimming pool in the Barnum School in said District.

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that the bonds of School District No. 1 Fractional Townships of Bloomfield, Troy, Royal Oak and Southfield in the aggregate sum of \$35,000.00 be issued in accordance with the vote of the electors, for the purpose of building and equipping a swimming pool in the Barnum School in said District, that said issue consist of thirty five bonds of \$1,000.00 each, numbered 1 to 35, inclusive, to be dated June 15, 1929, and payable \$5,000 on June 15 of each year from 1932 to 1938, inclusive, with interest at the rate of 4 3/4% payable semi-annually on June 15 and December 15 of each year, evidenced by coupons attached to said bonds bearing the printed or lithographed signatures of the President and Secretary of the Board of Education both principal and interest being payable at Birmingham Savings Bank, Birmingham, Michigan.

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that the President and Secretary of the Board of Education sign and execute said bonds on behalf of the School District, and that said bonds when so executed be delivered to Detroit and Security Trust Co. the purchaser thereof, on payment to the Treasurer of the School District of the purchase price thereof, in accordance with the bid therefor which has been accepted.

D. 1929, with interest thereon at the rate of 4 3/4% per annum, payable semi-annually on the 15th day of June and December in each year, upon presentation and surrender of the proper interest coupons hereto attached, as they severally become due. Both Principal and interest hereof are payable in lawful money of the United States of America at Birmingham Savings Bank, Birmingham, Michigan.

Payable without penalty up to and including July 31, 1929. One cent penalty from August 1 to September 1, 1929, inclusive. Four per cent penalty from September 1 to October 31, 1929, inclusive. No taxes accepted by Village Treasurer after October 31, 1929, as the tax roll will be in the hands of the County Treasurer at Pontiac for collection.
