

VILLAGER JAILED AFTER CAR CRASH

Held As Disorderly; His Friends Also Fined In Pleasant Ridge

Fred Moldenhauer, of R. F. D. No. 4, in the Oakland County jail, serving a 15-day term for disorderly conduct in Pleasant Ridge Sunday. Moldenhauer, with Harvey Gamble, 1284 Perry street, Detroit, and Fred Squires, of Rochester, was arrested Sunday by Pleasant Ridge officers, after an accident in which Moldenhauer was injured.

Brought before Justice Fred Stanton Monday morning, Moldenhauer was given his choice of a \$25 fine or the jail term. Gamble, charged with driving while under the influence of liquor, was told to pay a \$150 fine, or serve 60 days in jail; and Squires, charged with disorderly conduct, was given a fine of \$25 with the alternative of spending 15 days in jail. Only Squires paid. Moldenhauer's injuries were treated at the Margrave hospital.

PREJUDICE AGAINST "HIGH BROW" MUSIC IS ENDED, DAMROSCH SAYS

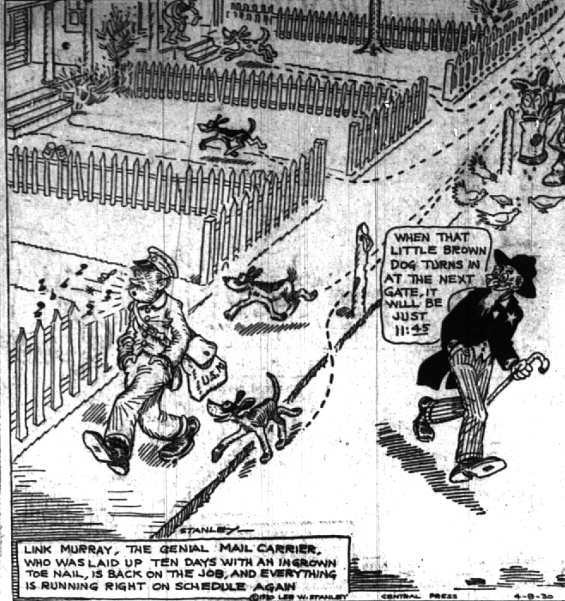

More than 5,000,000 children this year listened to the concerts, he said, and next year there is every indication that the Friday morning attendance at the broadcasts will be even greater.

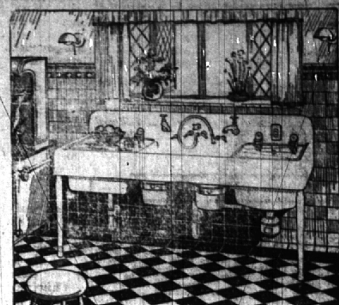

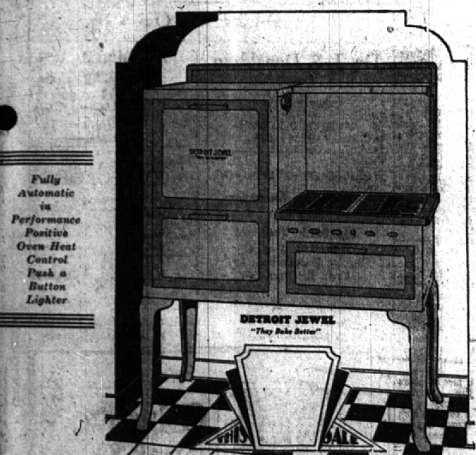

SPRING WEATHER ILLNESS GROWS

Health Officer's Report Shows Increase in Some Diseases

Contagious disease in the village continues on the increase with the advent of Spring weather, it is shown by the report for March of Dr. A. W. Newitt, health officer. Most of the illness was not serious, although there were seven cases of scarlet fever and three of pneumonia. The most prevalent type of illness found by Dr. Newitt was hemolytic streptococcus, of which there were 43 cases. Whooping cough, with 28 cases, was the second, and mumps, with 19, was the third most prevalent disease.

Mrs. Olga Benning, the public health nurse, made 242 home visits during the month to aid in the control of communicable disease. She accompanied 16 patients to the tuberculosis clinic, and two to hospitals. She referred 98 to physicians, and 40 to the various hospitals. Six restaurant workers were examined.

The laboratory report shows that 344 throat cultures were taken, which added to other samples tested, made a total of 369 analyses. The sanitary inspector made 114 store and three private calls and collected 62 milk and 19 water samples.
