CHANGES MADE IN 2 SUBJECTS AT BALDWIN HI

Biology And Physiography Courses Are Being Improved

INTEREST INCREASES

Several changes are being made in the biology and physiography courses of Baldwin High school as the result of an investigation made by the instructors in these departments. In the past few years much progress has been made in improving the teaching of these subjects in Michigan schools, and according to Miss Freda Huggett, biology instructor, in comparison with other Michigan schools of Baldwin's size, Baldwin has not kept advance with the modern methods of teaching biology. Miss Huggett advocates a one-year course in biology in place of the present half year term required for credit providing laboratory hours in addition to the regular class periods. not popular in Michigan schools. Only three out of 25 schools state that the subject is a part of their curriculum, and two of these teach geology which is an old study of physiography. According to W. S. Toothaker, science instructor in Baldwin High school for many years, interest in this subject has increased in Baldwin and now 80 students are enrolled. This is in contrast to the small classes of four years ago. Miss Bradley and Miss Huggett have been considering several new textbooks for biology and physiography courses before recommending a change.
