

**TOOL SHED FIRE
LOSS IS \$1,000**

Auto, Machinery, Equipment Are Destroyed in Grass Fires in Week

Loss of about \$1,000 was sustained by the Meyerling Land Co. when a tool shed on their West Maple avenue subdivision was destroyed by fire early Monday morning.

The shed contained an automobile, and several kinds of machinery and tools John H. Meyerling said. The Birmingham fire department responded to the alarm, but the contents of the shed had already been destroyed.

Twelve grass fires have been extinguished by the Birmingham fire department since last Thursday morning, the department reported. On Aug. 9, the fire department answered two alarms, both sent in because the refrigerator motor was smoking. One was at Shain's drug store, and the other at the home of Zolner Dowling, at 328 Larchlea.

**Thieves Ransack
Community House**

Second hand clothing from the Thrift shop of the Birmingham Community House was stolen Tuesday night by thieves who entered the building through a rear window and ransacked the entire house except the hostess' apartment.

As the Thrift shop was left locked and as only members of the staff have a key access to the room must have been gained by someone who took a wax impression of the lock, Mrs. Charles J. Shain, president of the Community House association, believes the door was found open in the morning.

The rest of the building was found in disorder with drawers open, and their contents strewn about. Members of the staff believe that the house was ransacked by young boys.

**Delay Is Granted
In Bad Check Case**

Examination of Charles W. Chapman, 617 South Connecticut street, Royal Oak, held on a charge of uttering and publishing, was adjourned Friday until tomorrow, when it will be held before Justice Floyd S. Beck.

Chapman is out on \$500 bond, after pleading not guilty, July 25, in the Court of Justice J. W. Bovee, of Royal Oak. The William H. Byrne and Son Co., a Detroit hardware firm, charges that Chapman last November gave them a check for \$143.96, in payment for a bill, and that the check was returned to them.

At the examination Friday, it was revealed that the Byrne Co. had previously sued Chapman for the amount of the check and won a judgment, part of which they had collected. On this ground, Chapman's attorney asked the case be dismissed. The case was adjourned, and attorneys for the defense and prosecution were requested to submit briefs on the subject.

It is not known yet how the thieves gained entrance. A value on goods stolen, which was insured, has not yet been estimated. Detective Joseph McGregor was assigned to the case.
