JANE FRENCH REUNION ATTRACTS VILLAGERS
The twelfth annual reunion of descendants of Jane French was held at Raleigh Throop's residence in Laidley Saturday, October 11, 1929. Oakland County is reeking with political aspirations this year, as deluge of candidates seek the suffrage of those who live within its borders. The other night, down in the Southern part of Oakland County Republican club got together and endorsed several candidates for county offices.

Among those whom the Southern Oakland County group endorsed are Wilbur M. Brucker for Governor; James Couzens for Senator; Grant Hudson as Congressman; Norman C. Orr, Burton P. Daugherty, and Albert W. Wilson for county prosecutor, county clerk and county treasurer respectively. Harry Merritt and Earl Phillips, present Circuit Court judges, also are endorsed for re-election.

Arthur W. Spencer seems to be their choice over John G. Wrenn for county commissioner, although Wrenn is making a great effort to win over the present incumbent, Spencer. Maurice Baldwin, county recorder, is the choice of those who favor the William Wheeler and Lee Pack, of Royal Oak, are opposing present sheriff Frank Schram for this office. Wheeler is the Royal Oakian's choice. Schram is conceded major support in Pontiac and points north, as well as a large part of Bloomfield Township.

Norman C. Orr, county prosecutor, is the choice for re-election to his second year; many feel that Mr. Orr is entitled to re-election in his opponent, Clarence Smith, of Pontiac, if for no other reason than that prosecutors are conceded two terms as a matter of tradition. It has been pointed out that Orr, by nature a crusading type of lawyer, has done much to prevent the organized racketeer from invading Oakland County.

He has related on several occasions that his stand against racketeers has been directed his way by Wayne County undercover men in gambling devices and other forms of "recreation" in Oakland County. "They shall never gain a foothold in Oakland County as long as I am prosecutor," declares Orr.
