

FISHERMEN LEAD IN COURT FINES

County officers are concentrating in a drive against illegal fishing, according to the July report of Justice Floyd S. Buck, which reveals that \$370 was collected in the month in his court from 27 persons convicted of taking under-bird fish from the water; while five convicted of the same offense, were sentenced to 15 days each in jail and one other, to 20 days in jail. Fines ranged from \$10 to \$40.

over to circuit court; five young men for indecent exposure, 20 days each in jail; man convicted of embezzlement, eight dollars and 20 days; man accused of non-support, found not guilty; transient company for lacking rear plate on truck, five dollars; cash, mother, for lacking both rear plates and mirror, \$10; and man accused of forgery, bound over to circuit court.

Fines collected from persons arrested in Bloomfield Hills amounted to \$1,225. Justice Buck's report shows, These were all divided into two categories as follows: 35 persons convicted of disorderly conduct paid a total of \$1,135, and six reckless drivers paid \$95.

Offenders against Birmingham statutes paid \$290.10 in fines in Justice Buck's court, according to his report to the village. Five signal offenders paid \$33.30 all together; 13 speeders paid \$173; one person lacking an operator's license, handled by Justice Buck during July were as follows: transit company convicted of not displaying plates on a trailer, five dollars costs; another, of not finishing a truck with a rear view mirror, five dollars' costs; bound accused of bastardy, bound

Ramblings from the Road

(Editor's Note: This is the fourth of a series of five articles describing the nine-day motor camp-trip which the author and another local high school student, Donald B. Stewart, recently completed. The boys toured parts of Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, and Michigan, principally the Upper Peninsula. They took all their own equipment and camped and cooked outdoors on the trip.)

Stoddard White Early Saturday morning, after a good night's sleep in the Bishop Hill State Park overlooking Marquette (we had gone to bed early in preparation for an early rising) we pulled stakes and rolled out on the road to Munising, which because of its beautiful hill-studded harbor has been described as the "Naples of America." Just after leaving the city of Marquette we passed the State Reformatory and Branch Prison, which consists of large buildings and fields in a beautiful location on Lake Superior.

Over good road we made excellent time to Munising, arriving there about 8:30 a. m. in plenty of time for the large motor launch, powered by twin automobile engines, which will take us on the 40-mile round trip to the "Pictured Rocks of Lake Superior," famed as one of the scenic spots of this part of the country. We certainly acclaim them as such, and consider that without seeing them there would have been something missing from our trip.

After accumulating four passengers (the least number with which they will start), we put out on the beautiful harbor into the lake, keeping about half a mile offshore. After about three-quarters of an hour we began to see signs of the Rocks, which stretch all along the shore from Munising to Grand Marais.
