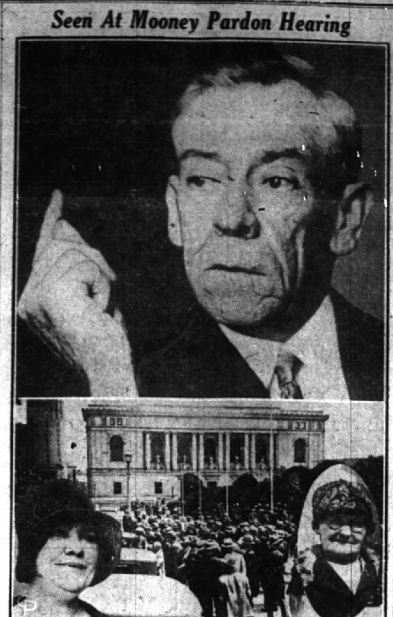

WARM WEATHER ENCOURAGES READING SAYS LIBRARIAN

A great deal more reading is done during the summer, especially during the extremely warm periods," reports Mrs. Nancy B. Thomas, librarian at the Baldwin Public Library. Although no book reservations are permitted in summer, residents desiring to take books on vacation trips for several weeks may make arrangements at the library.

The July library report shows a total circulation of 6241, of which the circulation at the Pierce school branch library was 240. In July 1929, the circulation was 5898, showing an increase in July 1930 of 343. A total of 77 new registrations were taken in July including 56 adult, 17 juvenile, and 4 adult non-resident registrations; only one registration has been withdrawn. The total number of registrants is now 849.

Three Arrested In Rear-ended Crash

Buck following an accident in which the car he was driving crashed into the Woodward and Long Lake road. The mail term was suspended when Sluka agreed to pay for the damages to Carlisle's car. Dutchak paid his fine and Hendrick chose the jail sentence.

Wood, at the time, was coming from the entrance of the J. H. De Visser estate, where he is employed.

Innes claimed that he had passed Lone Pine road just as the light was changing, while Wood asserted that it had already changed to red when Innes passed through and struck him. No one was injured, and no arrests were made by the Hills police department, which investigated the accident.
