Moved by Commissioner Kuehn and

that ORDINANCE NO. 23 be read.
HILLS ORDINANCES
Section 1. That the Ordinance shall
constitute the "Annual Village Appro-
priation Bill."
Section 2. That the sum of \$18,000.00
recommended by the Board of Educa-
tion shall be, and the same is hereby
appropriated for the purpose herein set
forth for the next fiscal year, and that
the same shall be raised by general tax-
ation upon the assessed valuation of all
taxable property within the Village.
Section 3. That the Village Clerk is
ordered to certify amount appropriated
in this Ordinance to the Village Au-
thorities.
Section 4. That public necessity and
convenience of the Charter require the
immediate adoption of this Ordinance.
Section 5. That the Ordinance shall
take immediate effect.
