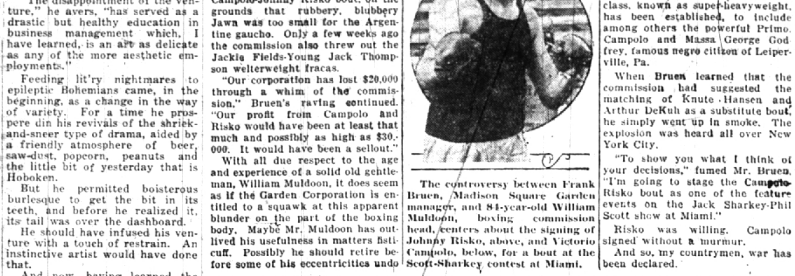

"I'm getting good and tired of all this," declared Joseph J. Bruen, general manager of the Garden, upon his return to New York from Florida. "This is the last time they'll pull that kind of a stunt without a showdown."

By "that kind of a stunt," Bruen had reference to the commission's ban placed on the proposed Victorio Campolo-Johnny Risko bout, on the grounds that rubbery, blubbery Jawa was too small for the big ten gaucha. Only a few weeks ago the commission also threw out the Jackie Fields-Young Jack Thompson welterweight


This is advice worth heeding. Too many Americans are too greatly impressed by things European. "Our republic's record in the world entitles us to have some respect for the American viewpoint."

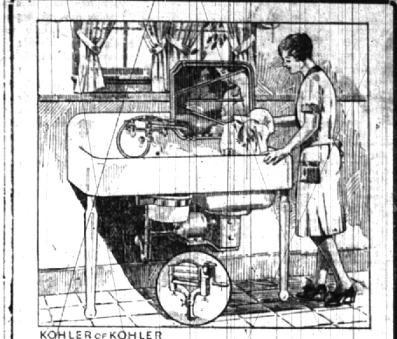
