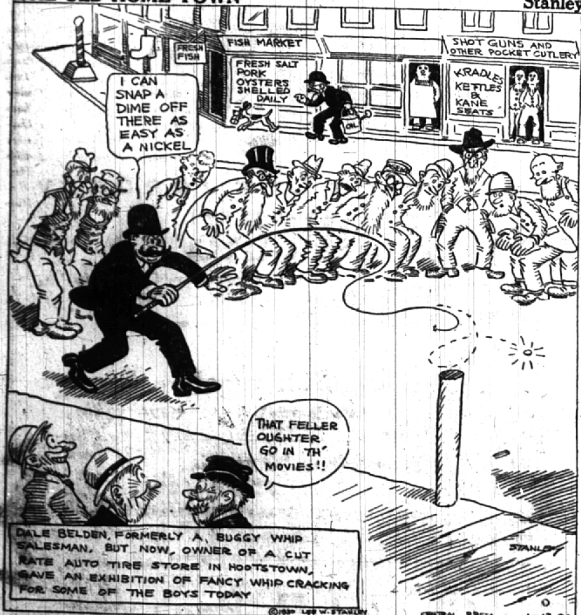

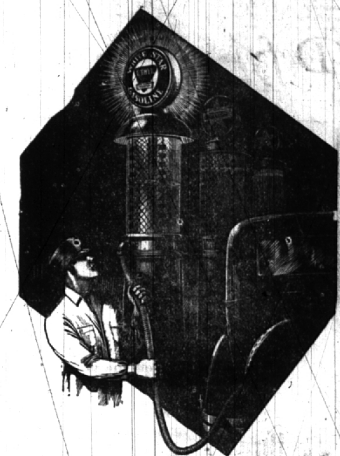
An International Disgrace
