LAST DEBATE TEST OF SERIES AT DEARBORN

Baldwin Orators To Compete In Final Of Preliminaries Jan. 24

SAME TEAM CHOSEN

Birmingham debating team will participate in the fourth and last debate of the preliminary series with Dearborn at Dearborn High School, Jan. 24. The Baldwin team, will, for the second time, support the negative case of the question, having won the last debate from Monroe and the two previous debates in which they upheld the affirmative side. The team will be composed of the returned speakers, Peggy Hart, Mary Hutchinson, and Geraldine Kessler. Professor Fredrick McKay, of the Speech Department of Michigan State Normal College, will act as single critic judge for the contest.

On the same date, Jan. 24, 266 high schools of the State represented by 728 high school debaters will meet in 133 debates. Upon the completion of this fourth and final round of debates, the records established by all member schools in the four debates will be computed and the 64 schools with the highest records will be declared eligible to enter the Elimination Series of debates which will begin Feb. 14.

When these 64 schools are notified of their eligibility to enter this final race for state forensics honors, each school will be presented with a University of Michigan Wall Plaque Trophy, which is a mahogany shield 18 inches high and 14 inches wide upon which is superimposed an engraved bronze medallion nine inches in diameter.

These 64 schools will then debate among themselves until only two undefeated schools remain. These will be brought to Ann Arbor by the University of Michigan for the Final State Championship debate to be held on Apr. 25. ACORNS BEAT BALKEN FIVE IN CLOSE TILT

Royal Oak Cagers Overcome Lead To Nose Out Local Quintet, 15-14

CLASH AGAIN FEB. 18

The Birmingham High School cagers quintet lost its first S. E. A. League game of the basketball year Friday, falling before a determined Royal Oak High School five by a one point margin, 15 to 14, in the hardest and most thrilling battle so far this season on the Acorns court.

Royal Oak earned the winning one-point lead a minute and a half before the final gun when Cook dribbled the sphere on a side-shot after both teams had turned the fourth quarter into a track meet. Birmingham led the Blue and White until the middle of the final episode. Cook boosted the Royal Oak team two points early in the fourth making the score 12-11, but still in favor of Birmingham. Shortly after, Neiger followed with another tally for the Acorns and Royal Oak was leading the score by a one point edge, 13-12. At this stage of the frame the game was transformed into a series of races. The ball was dribbled from one end of the floor to the other only to be lost to the opposing team or to be knocked from its intended mark. Shave took the ball half the length of the floor to score after he had intercepted a pass to set the tone at 14-13 for the Maroon and White.

Cook's Score Turned Tide
Birmingham had the game pocketed until Cook bagged the side-shot that spelled defeat for the Blue and White. Ladd failed to add to the Baldwin score, taking long tosses at the hoop during the remaining seconds of play.

Nearly 300 people gathered in the Royal Oak gymnasium to witness the tilt. Birmingham had a large representation on the sidelines, many of them townspeople. The Royal Oak High School band furnished music for the occasion. The Oaks and Maples have been rivals for more than 10 years in basketball and football and have always offered keen competition for each other.

Birmingham's big losses for the grid victory that Baldwin gained last Thanksgiving Day. Royal Oak and Birmingham clash again on Feb. 18 in a non-league game on the Baldwin floor.

Berg accounted for Birmingham's two points shortly after when he scored from close range. Neiger and Woodward finished the frame with two baskets for the Oaks.

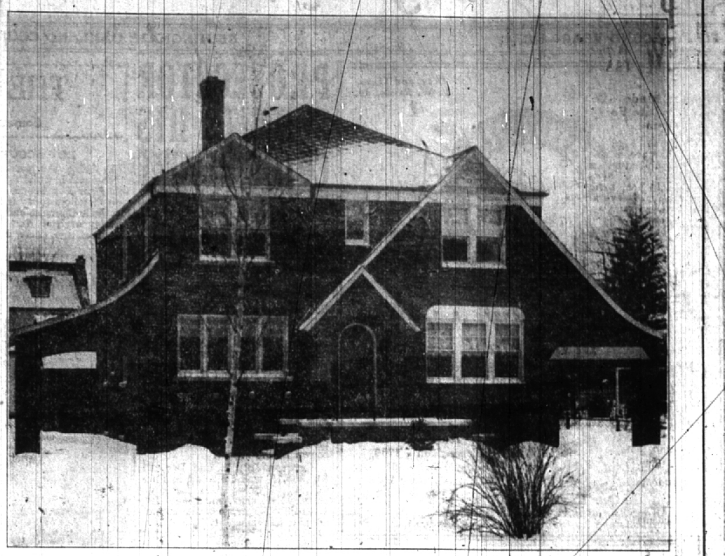
A tight Maroon defense held the Oaks for a great part of the game. Royal Oak's passing attack was more erratic than efficient and many of the chances in the final period were wild or intercepted by the battling Baldwins. Inaccuracy in shooting prevented Birmingham from having a higher score in the last quarter when several of the intercepted passes were dribbled the whole length of the floor to be wasted in bad aims at the net.

In a preliminary game the Birmingham High School's second team was defeated by the Royal Oak High second string men, 17-4.
