RUSSIA MAKES USE OF UNCLE SAM'S BUSINESS BRAINS



Even if Russia doesn't like Uncle Sam's diplomatic manners she is utilizing his mechanical and business ability to the utmost. Contracts amounting to millions of dollars have been let in the United States by the Soviet government. One of the most ambitious projects undertaken by the Russians is the construction of a town, 300 miles east of Moscow, near Nishin Novegord, for a population of approximately 35,000. The town is to be the seat of an automobile plant which is to turn out 100,000 Ford care yearly. Actual designing is being done by engineers of a Cheveland company, but the construction will be done by Russian labor.
