Fox was accused, in the picturesque terminology of the law, of "harboring a dog, which by loud and frequent barking, yelping or howling, causes annoyance to the residents within the immediate neighborhood." He was summoned to appear for trial July 16—yesterday. Yesterday arrived and the trial was on. Mrs. Whitmore, the husband, Harry C. Whitmore, her sister, William Smith and

Justice Buck mediated; and his mediation completed, found (Fox) to pay a fine of \$25, or have the dog killed. Fox chose the latter, and was released while police officers committed the official execution.

NEPOOL MAKES SWIMMERS

27 Boys And 11 Girls Given Beginner's Badges By Engel

A large number of both boys and girls have passed beginner's swimmer, and life-saving entrance examination tests since the opening of the pool. The tests were given by E. T. Engel and Mrs. Ella Engel, supervisors of swimming.

Twenty-seven more boys have received beginner's badges, awarded them for the beginner's test, which requires swimming 25 feet, making a sharp turn around, and swimming back 25 feet. They are now permitted in the deep end of the pool. They are: Millard Plumsted, Joe Lambert, Norman Anderson, John Stanger, Elmer, Holsh Morris Hoyt, Jack Reynolds, George Forester, William Morrow, and Roy Meyer.

The list of swimmers has been increased by six boys. The swimmer test requires the student to swim 100 yards, swim 50 feet on the back without using hands, retrieve an object in 10 to 8 feet of water by a surface dive, demonstrate a free dive satisfactory for a scuba or artificial demonstration. The 13 boys who have passed these requirements and have been given the swimmer's badge from the American Red Cross are:

Of a class of 37 in life saving, 10 boys have already had one period of instruction. Six hours are required before the swimmer may take the final test entitling him to the American Red Cross emblem.
