Many taxpayers spoke in favor of a week in spring for vacation period. Motion by Frank Reaume, seconded by Mr. Greg, that week vacation be taken at Easter time. Carried.

Motion by Frank Reaume, seconded by Mrs. Burns, that the next annual meeting be held on the second Monday in July, 1931, at 8:15 P. M. Carried.
