## Don't Fail To Try These

**ICE BOX ROLLS**  
One cake yeast, one-half cup sugar, two-thirds cup shortening, one-half cup cup sugar, one teaspoon salt, one cup mashed potatoes, one cup scalded milk, two eggs well beaten, flour to make a stiff dough. Dissolve yeast cake in lukewarm water, add shortening, sugar, salt and mashed potatoes to scalded milk, stirring to mix thoroughly. When cool, add dissolved yeast cake and eggs. Again mix well. Add sufficient flour to make a stiff dough. Turn out on to a lightly floured board and knead thoroughly. Put into a bowl large enough to allow slight rising. Rub over with melted shortening, cover tightly and place in refrigerator. About an hour before meal time, pinch off the dough, shape into rolls and let rise until light. Bake in a hot oven, 425 degrees Fahrenheit, 15 to 20 minutes.
