### Lift Quarantine On Juvenile Home

The Oakland County Juvenile Home on Telegraph road, which has been under quarantine for two weeks is expected to be re-opened to the public this week. Frank S. Jackson, county juvenile agent, announced late yesterday.

Sixteen youths were ill with diphtheria at one time, Mr. Jackson said, but with constant care of the patients and cultures taken daily, it is expected that the quarantine will be lifted within a few days by Dr. John D. Monroe, county health officer.

Although parents and relatives of the boys affected with the disease were not permitted to see them during the quarantine period, parents and relatives of the boys who were not affected were permitted. "There is no further danger of the spread of the disease and the segregation of the boys helped reduce spreading of the disease," Mr. Jackson said.

### Alleged Rum Seller Freed

Harry Ewald, of Pontiac, charged with selling liquor, was dismissed Tuesday in the court of Justice Floyd S. Buck on recommendation of Assistant Prosecutor Thomas Gillette, when the witness for the people, Hurtle Bashore, of Pontiac, testified that the defendant was not the man from whom Park Nique, the Pontiac officer who made the arrest, had bought the liquor. Nique was not present. Ewald was arrested on a warrant sworn out May 10 and arraigned two days later in Justice Buck's court. He pleaded not guilty, demanded an examination, and furnished bond of \$1,000. Examination, set for May 20, was postponed twice, and finally held Tuesday in Justice Buck's court. Bashore testified that he had accompanied Nique when the latter made the purchase May 4, and that Ewald was not the man who had sold them the liquor.
