

**CHRISTIAN SCIENTISTS CONDUCT ANNUAL MEETING AT BOSTON**

Boston, Mass.—At the annual meeting of the First Church of Christ, Scientist, and Mother Church, in Boston on Monday, announcement was made that 82 new churches and societies of the denomination have been formed during the past year. Twenty-one of these are in Europe. More than 6,000 Christian Scientists attended the meeting.

Duncan Sinclair of Boston was appointed president for the coming year. He was formerly a lecturer on Metallurgy and head of the science department of Glasgow Academy. New members of the Board of Lecturers are Miss Ethel M. Whitcomb, of Boston, formerly Second Reader of the Mother Church, and Ralph E. Schofield, of London, who served as Captain in the British Army in France and Belgium during the Great War, and was afterwards an employer of Lloyd's, London.

The treasurer's report showed a balance on hand of \$215,344.01 in the general fund, and \$632,761.74 in trust funds. Expenditures for the year were \$1,887,636.01, which included \$734,495 spent in construction of the Sanatorium of the Christian Science Benevolent Association at San Francisco.

More than 3,000,000 persons attended public Christian Science lectures during the year it was reported. Relief funds were expended to aid sufferers from the hurricanes in Florida, and from floods in Vermont, Kansas, the Mississippi Valley, and in Tasmania. Relief work in the Government hospital for disabled veterans at Otsego, N. C., has continued, and has some work in Germany, and contribution recently was made to China Child Welfare, Inc.

Increase in the circulation of all the periodicals of the denomination were noted. The circulation of the weekly Christian Science Sentinel is now 121,000.

Mrs. Annie M. Knott, a member of the Christian Science Board of Directors, formerly of Detroit, called attention to the substantial number of Christian Scientists

This solves the reaching factor so hazardous to the back and feet.

Next, the distance between the heels is an important point. Lay a ruler down on the floor and measure the distance between the heels. Jones will stand with his heels close together, at no time does he exceed 12 inches. Try them both and pick the one that feels more comfortable.

**TIMELY TREATMENT WILL CHECK INSECT OUTBREAKS**

Disease and insect outbreaks can be avoided, or checked in many instances by timely treatment. In some cases it may be sufficient to apply spray or dust to necessary to begin by treating seeds or bulbs, while in others it is sufficient to apply spray or dust to growing plants. Some insects, such as caterpillars and beetles, work in moist, sprays, when the plants are dry. They should be used early in the season as a preventive. Care should be used in the keeping, handling and spraying of insecticides and all possible precautions taken to prevent children or animals from getting hold of them.

**TRIM CAREFULLY**

A common idea in trimming shade trees is that they should be topped to stimulate a more vigorous growth. This practice is entirely wrong since it permanently disfigures a tree and usually tends to shorten its life. Topping has been recommended for trees near overhead utility lines, in the vicinity of airports, and near homes used they check the fungus with hand-picking. The substances used against insects are termed

on for the trees and should only be done in cases of extreme necessity.

**INSPECT ROSES**

Rose bushes should be closely inspected at this season of the year for the appearance of aphids or plant lice. These pests usually collect at the ends of the growing shoots and suck the juice from the new stems, leaves and buds. Nicotine sulphate commonly known as Black Leaf 40 should be sprayed on the plants as soon as the aphids appear.

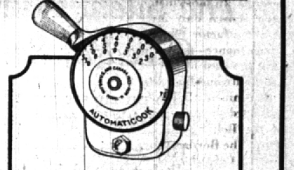
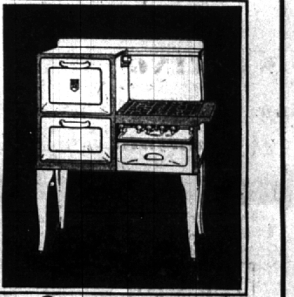
