

LEGION MEETS AT NEW HOUSE

CLUBS TO ATTEND AVIATION DINNER

Ex-Soldier Group Also Member Of Community House Organization

The Charles Edwards Post of the American Legion meets in the Community House the third Wednesday of every month. It is composed of 68 ex-service men of the village, and functions as a branch of a national organization of World War veterans.

The Birmingham post was started nearly 11 years ago with the application for the national charter made in June 1919. At that time the post had 21 members, headed by Charles B. Randall, secretary. A year later, a permanent charter was granted, and S. McAlpine was named adjutant.

Members of the Charles Edwards post play an active part in both Legion and village activities. Their principal work is with the Otter Lake Bill for the children of former service men. The post also helps the Battle Creek Tuberculosis sanatorium. They sponsor Troop 88 of the Boy Scouts and stage an annual program of education in flag history in the village schools.

Present officers are Lloyd Stanley, commander; Edward V. Myers, adjutant; David Thompson, vice commander; Gerard Putters, finance officer; E. J. Mathieu, sergeant at arms; and Gordon Bailey, welfare officer.
