return to Iowa December 31. He has been terribly hurt—inside. The old smile is forced; the joviality that has made him an idol from Monroe to Ontonagon, is gone. No man can do his best when his spirit is down. As Chase S. Osborn said in the Soo News of Feb. 24, in far and away the most laudatory editorial given the Governor:

There are few men who in their lifetime have not been unwittingly and unwillingly where they would not have their presence advertised. This is not an admission of an excuse for or a defense of anything that Governor Green may or may not have done during his lifetime. But we do wish to state that we have known him for a third of a century intimately and have never seen or act of sneakiness or hypocrisy or lawlessness on his part. This must be true or he could not have the moral standing and the complete confidence and respect of all the people without reference to partisanship in his little home town where he has lived for a quarter of a century and where the tone is as fine and wholesome as any spot in the world. If Fred Green were not all right Iowa would have repudiated him long years ago. They shall resent this connection of his name in a way to reflect upon him even more than he will. Fred Green is a good member of

the Presbyterian church and his character is above reproach.

His friends know that as a plain man to man friend Governor Green's virtues outweigh his faults ten to one, but it is the popular thing to believe and magnify the evil about people who are rated higher in the social or religious scale than we register. As cruel as it is to say, most people get more enjoyment out of failure than they do in the success. Of the other fellow, Governor Green has powerful friends like the Big Four, for example, who will see to it that his retirement from public life is sweet and that his word still has a commanding influence in the next state convention but as for trying to carry through another state wide primary contest Governor Green, when the time comes, will be content to rest his political laurels on his two terms as governor of his native state.

And this opinion by a person who knows the fine homely qualities of Fred Green, the friend and neighbor. His private and political life has been concerned only with unselfish service. If Fred Green wants to stay in public life he has our sincere friendship and good will. The time to be a friend is when friendliness is needed. Win, lose, draw or retire, Fred W. YOUTH TO APPEAR ON THEFT CHARGE

Pontiac Boy Will Be Examined Tomorrow For Galf Club Robbery

Examination of William Stockwell, 385 Ferry avenue, Pontiac, arrested Friday charged with entering the Bloomfield Hills Country club and stealing three leather jackets and two pairs of shoes from the locker rooms, will be held in the court of Justice Floyd S. Buck tomorrow.

Stockwell, who is 18 years old, when arraigned in Justice Buck's court Friday, admitted that he had been in the locker room on Mar. 6, the day on which the clothing was reported missing. He stood mute, and a plea of not guilty was entered by the court. A bond of \$2,000 was not furnished, and he was committed to jail.

Delos Anderson, of the Bloomfield Hills Police department, after recovering the stolen articles, arrested Stockwell and another youth of 16, who was turned over to the juvenile court, from which he will probably be sent to the detention home at Lansing. Both he and Stockwell were on parole from the juvenile court after breaking and entering the home of Edward Donnelly at Woodward and Long Lake roads a year ago, with two other boys, Chief Putman said.
