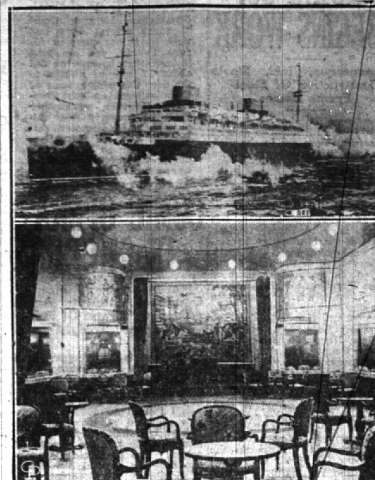

FACTS AND FANCIES
In announcements made last week the College of Law at Northwestern University is "off" Blackstone, whose works have for years been regarded as the best authority. "Blackstone's day is not our day and his law cannot be the standard as the standard attributed to Dean Leon Green.

There can be little doubt that the public school system, in its changing times, is being changed to the legal code, but basic law is not materially changed. Different than it was in Blackstone's time. The big trouble with our educational system today, is that instead of resting on fundamentals it is being made the playing field for the notions of a select few who believe themselves to be the intelligentsia and resent criticism from any source.

Blackstone may have lived a number of years ago, but he gave expression to logical legal reasoning that cannot be put on the black list because of the notion of Dean Leon Green any more than spelling, English and arithmetic can be relegated to the background of the public school system, for music, art and nature study without objection from the general public.

It is a sad commentary, that educational affairs in Michigan have reached the point where the taxpayer who supports the institution is forced to make his contribution and then has nothing to say as to how, why or what his money is spent for, except very indirectly. The public is supposed to be represented by its school boards, but they are forced by law to do about 90 percent of the various things which they tentatively supervise.

Notwithstanding the mounting costs of education any objector is held up to ridicule and scorn on the ground that he is attempting to hold back progress, and the plea is made to other parents that the welfare of their children is to be jeopardized if school heads cannot be given free rein.
