

DAMAGE SUIT AWARD GIVEN

\$2,500 Verdict Given Hazel Park Woman For Injuries

Mrs. Cynthia Waters, of Hazel Park, Tuesday was awarded \$2,500 in a \$50,000 suit for damages in the Oakland Circuit Court against the Taylor Construction Co., of Birmingham.

Mrs. Waters testified that on Aug. 18, 1929, she suffered severe injuries at the Big Beaver and Adams roads when the automobile in which she was riding plunged

into a hole at the intersection which was being paved by the Taylor Construction Co. She charged that the construction company neglected to erect barriers to warn motorists of the condition of the road and that the driver of the car, Elmer Babcock, drove into the intersection which was torn up, because he could not see any warning signs.

The defendants claimed that warning signs had been placed at the intersection where the construction was in progress.

PLAY LACROSSE AT CRANBROOK

An innovation in the sports life of Birmingham will be staged in the Cranbrook School stadium this Sunday when an exhibition lacrosse game will be played by

members of the Lacrosse Unit of the Canadian Club of Detroit under the auspices of the Cranbrook School. The game, which will be open to the public, will be the first instance in this locality of a nationwide revival of this exciting old game which had its origin among the Indian Tribes.

Like hockey, the game consists of attempting to shoot the ball or puck into the opponents' net, and to do so a team of 12 men is used. There are five attack players, five defense men, a center and goalie, and the plan of action is similar to that used in hockey, only in place of the hockey stick a "crosse" is used, being a curved stick with a rawhide net attached inside the curve. With this stick a rubber ball is carried or hurled through the air to make passes and shots at goal.

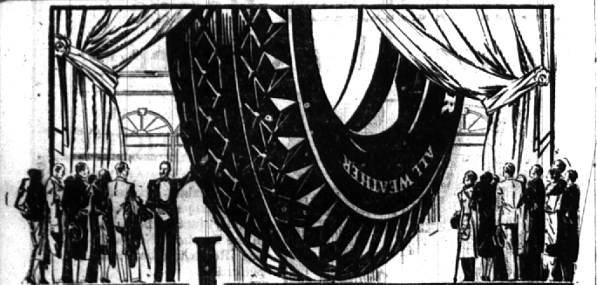

WRITER TELLS ABOUT RUBBER

A. M. Smith Talks To Exchange Club About Brazilian Products

A. M. Smith, a Detroit newspaperman whose friendship with Henry Ford has resulted in the public's better understanding of the billionaire manufacturer, Tuesday told members of the Birmingham Exchange Club of Brazil and Ford's 4,000,000 acre rubber plantation near Para.

Mr. Smith, as a representative of the North American Newspaper Alliance, last year went as a guest of Mr. Ford to the South American plantation, writing a series of articles on the country and the rubber industry.

Several roads in England are now constructed of rubber, Mr. Smith said, and they give better service; are quieter and have a longer life than concrete pavement. Malaria and hook-worm, the two most prevalent diseases in Brazil are being gradually combated with success, he said.

Mr. Smith was the guest of Mr. E. W. Osborne.
