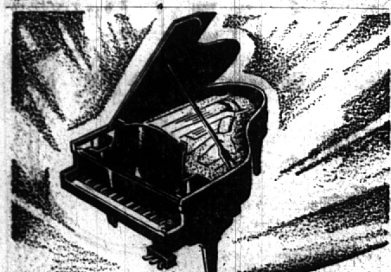

The map illustrated above is a small scale reproduction of one of four sheets of a Sectional Road Map Series indicating main connecting highways between the United States and Canada, that is

issued by the Department of the Interior at Ottawa. Our readers will be glad to learn that the Canadian Government will supply copies of the map, on a large scale, with full detail, free of charge. Interesting booklets are also obtainable, citing the motorist, camping, fishing and other recrea-

tional facilities of the country as a whole. Likewise specific data concerning any particular province or district may be obtained, if desired. Applications should be addressed to the Natural Resources Intelligence Service of the Department of the Interior at Ottawa, Canada.

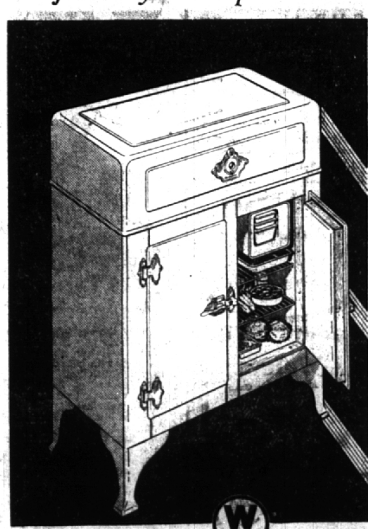

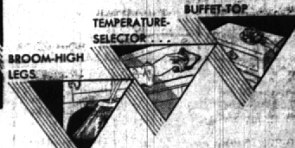
