

SIX HOSPITAL EMPLOYEES OUT

Board of Auditors Announces Dismissal of County Workers

The Oakland County Board of Auditors on Saturday announced the dismissal of six employees of the Oakland County Tuberculosis Hospital, including the business manager, Floyd E. Babcock, former county clerk and postmaster for the City of Pontiac.

Babcock's salary was \$4,600 a year while an allowance is to be made in the new budget of only \$2,400 for the position he held, the board announced.

Other employees dismissed are Otto Skutt, farm superintendent; Miss Vilva Burnsworth, dietitian; Lillian E. Brown, telephone operator, Robert Fawcett, farm manager, and Henry Post, in charge of the attendant's home.
