

ROTARY CLUB HEARS PASTOR

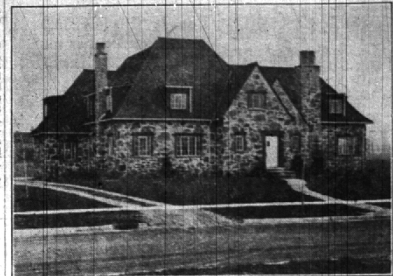
Rev. David Davies, of Windsor, Heard in Talk On Int'l Relations

Upon the confidence which comes from straight dealing, whether it be between two men or two nations, depends the future peace of the world. Unless we grant the people of other lands the same right to their feelings of patriotism that we hold dear, we shall misunderstand them, and bring about strained relations.

That is what Rev. David Davies, pastor of the Windsor Episcopal church, and secretary of the Windsor Rotary club, told Birmingham Rotarians Monday noon at the Community House. The program was on "International Relations" and in charge of Charles J. Shain, local druggist, who introduced the speaker.

Mr. Shain's brief introduction mentioned the fact that the cable, the telephone and radio, the fact that steamship and airplane travel had brought the nations of the world together in a manner that makes possible the eventual attainment of international understanding. He then referred to the present, international aspects of Rotary as a movement for world peace, and stated that it spread to 62 countries, with a membership of 160.

Situation Different

"Until recent years the people of the world have left the conditions of international friendship to their politicians, their diplomats, feeling that they only were responsible for the maintenance of peaceful relations; but now the situation is different, for the development of communication and transportation devices have brought the peoples of the earth together in such a fashion that no longer are we able to live without being dependent upon others," stated Rev. Davies. "The peoples of all countries are in part world travelers, and owners of properties that spread over the whole globe. In our growth toward higher civilization, we have come to know the men and women of other countries, and we have found that they, like ourselves, are possessed of the same human yearnings, the ideals, the desire to laugh and play, the fact that they speak different languages is only an artificial barrier to our mutual understanding of them and their problems."

"Patriotism is a fine thing, but it has come to be interpreted these days as not only a love of country and willingness to serve in times of necessity, as war, but also it embodies all the elements of good will that tend to bring the people of all countries to a world-mindedness. We must grant other peoples the right to their own traditions and customs, and they will grant us ours in return. Rotary, and our movements, is becoming the modern force to leaven the business and professional men of the world to a mutual understanding of world problems. From it can come a higher civilization, a lasting peace, I am sure."

Walter Connelly, president of the club, praised the meeting last Monday when the Windsor Rotary club put on its annual Thanksgiving international meeting, offering as guest speaker the Honorable Dr. Herbert Schofield, of England, a distinguished scholar and Rotarian, who spoke on vocational service from a world viewpoint. On a motion offered by Mr. Shain, the club voted to consider going over in a body next year, and not holding a local meeting on that date.

There are approximately 80 families now receiving financial support in Troy township from the Troy Township welfare commission, Garner M. Miller, Troy Township supervisor announces. "This number of families does not include all of the Village of Clawson," Mr. Miller said. "Within the past week we have been able to obtain positions for six men and the Consumers Power company branch at Fourteen Mile road and Coolidge Highway also has employed two men. Some of our unemployed we have sent to the Birmingham Community House or the Royal Oak Welfare Commission for assistance during the past month."
