TIPSY DRIVER SENT TO JAIL

Detroit Given Fine, Prison Term for Causing Auto Accident

A fine of \$50 and a jail term of 30 days were the sentences passed Saturday morning by Judge Floyd S. Buck on Don Lawson, 627 East Euclid avenue, Detroit, because of an accident which occurred when driving south on Woodward avenue S. of Brady Lane attempted to pass an automobile driven by Adam Laskowski's car, knocking it across the street into the path of a northbound automobile driven by Gene Gardner.

Damages on Gardner's car amounted to approximately \$100. Police said that Lawson was intoxicated and arrested him. Judge Buck gave Lawson the alternative to the jail sentence of paying the damages on the car; and specified that if he failed to raise either the fine or the damages, he should serve 30 days in jail.
