

DOCTOR GIVES HEALTH TALK

Barnum Parent-Teachers Ass'n Hears Dr. Roehm At Second Meeting

Information and advice for the prevention and cure of many communicable diseases were given to members of the Barnum Parent-Teachers' association in their second meeting held at Barnum school Thursday afternoon, by Dr. Harold Roehm, Birmingham physician. Because no two medical statisticians give the same figures it is very difficult exactly to state the characteristics of a normal physical child, he said at the outset of his talk which was entitled "The Normal Child Physically."

"Old fashioned theories notwithstanding, a communicable disease never did anyone good," he said. "Smallpox perhaps is the most dreaded of these diseases and to immunize a child positively, one should have him vaccinated every five years," Dr. Roehm added.

Dangers Of Measles
In a serious case of measles, an abscessed cervical gland or an abscess in the middle ear should be avoided if possible, he said.
