

# WILL SURVEY CAMP GEORGE

Naturalist To Study Boy Scout Area Before Leave Here, Oct. 17

A survey of Camp George Birmingham Boy Scout camp on Lower Long Lake, will be made by Thomas McClure, of Detroit, nationally known naturalist, some time before his talk here Friday evening, Oct. 17, it is announced by the Birmingham District Committee, Boy Scouts of America.

Mr. McClure's survey will be made to determine the number of birds and animals living on the reservation, what fauna can best be induced to live there, and what can be done to exterminate possible deterrents to animals living there at present. He has made a number of these surveys for private citizens and in conjunction with the State Conservation department. Merely by walking through the property and examining it he is able to ascertain these facts.

Mr. McClure, who is president of the Audubon Society, vice-president of the Isaac Walton League, president of Rod and Fly, and associated with other outdoor organizations, is a descendant of a line of Scotch and English gamekeepers on English estates. In fact, he is the first of the line who is not actively engaged in the gamekeeping profession. However, he is actively in touch with the work and is an authority on the subject.
