Coch Johnson Optimistic About School's Football Prospects

42 TRY FOR POSTS

Prospects of a successful 1930 football season for the Baldwin High School team have been expressed by George F. Johnson, director of athletics, following a series of strenuous practice sessions at Pierce Field during the past week. Forty-two candidates, including 12 lettermen, were put through a succession of rigid drills and are expected to be in the best condition for the opening game here with Pontiac, Sept. 20.

Recently admitted to the Southern Athletic Association group, after it had signed a two-year contract with Baldwin, Pontiac is expected to present a formidable team in opposition to the Magpies this year as in the past. Last year, Baldwin was victorious, 7 to 6, in one of the best contests of the season. In 1928 Baldwin also defeated Pontiac, 13-6. Evidence points to a hard-fought game that should attract a large crowd.

Coch Johnson pins his hopes for a winning team this year in the line which averages approximately 200 pounds and is reputedly faster and more experienced than last year's forward wall. Although the opening line-up cannot be determined until the first practice,

Each program was concluded with the customary triple circuit of the field. More intensive scrimmage practice with passing, punting, running and "skull practice" are scheduled during the coming week. Scrimmage is also scheduled to occupy a part of the daily programs.

With the addition of Cranbrook School among the five home games and four other strong opponents in games out of town, Baldwin grid players are looking for a difficult season with high hopes of a high-standing in the league at the end of the season.

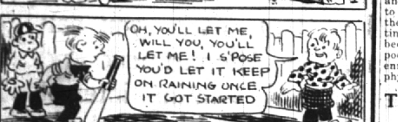
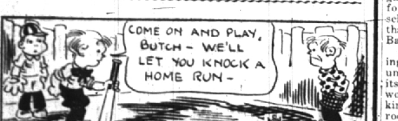
