Gail Is New President of Baldwin Group; Plans Are Discussed

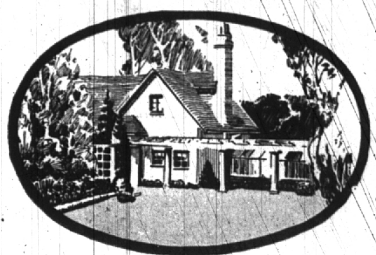
