PASTOR SCORES MOTION PICTURES

Rev. Woodward Says Reforms Are Needed In Amusement Industry

"The movies are as bad or worse than ever—and they constitute nothing short of a menace to the mental and moral life of America," declared the Rev. David Leon Woodward in his sermon Sunday at the First Baptist Church.
Promised reforms from within the motion picture industry has not been accomplished; the movies are controlled by monopolies that regulate the sale and distribution of pictures; motion picture advertising evidences "more stupidity and misrepresentation than in any other popular business and investigations reveal a great amount of scenes tending to cor-

rupt the morale of children, the Rev. Woodward charged.
Passage of the Brookhart bill to reform the monopolistic control of the movies, establishment of a federal motion picture commission to stimulate the production of more wholesome pictures, empowering of the State department to preview pictures before their exportation, reform of motion picture advertising and the co-operation of parents in selecting the shows their children may see, were the suggested reforms advocated by Mr. Woodward.

U. S. NAVY BAND TO AID LEGION WELFARE WORK

Two benefit concerts by the United States Navy Band in the afternoon and evening of Oct. 8, will be given in Pontiac under the auspices of the Oakland County post of the American Legion. SERVICE CLUBS OPEN PIN SERIES

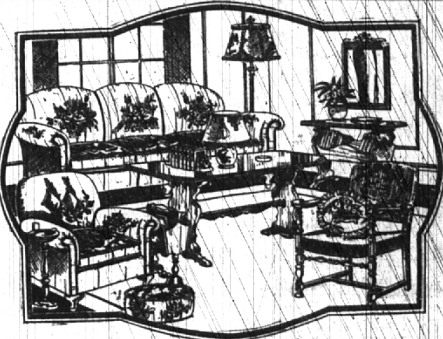
