

THROWN BY HORSE HUNTSMAN HURT

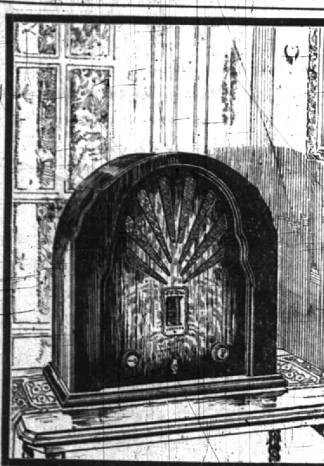
A. L. Kirby Recovering In Hospital From Injuries Suffered At Hunt Club
