

CELEBRATE LABOR DAY, 6 ARE FINED

Bloomfield Officers Have Active Day Arresting Men As Disorderly

Persons who celebrated Labor Day too convivially in Bloomfield Hills faced Justice. Floyd S. Buck Tuesday morning on charges of disorderly conduct, and paid fines amounting to \$270.

Mike Suzinski, 2771 Magnolia avenue, Detroit, said by Sgt. Dolan Anderson, who made the arrest, to be very drunk, at first pleaded not guilty and was committed to jail when he could not furnish \$100 bail. He later changed his plea and paid a \$60 fine.

Thomas Clifford, 2769 Magnolia avenue, who was with him, paid a fine of \$35.

J. R. Palmer, Brewer court, Pontiac, a motorist, paid a \$75 fine, and V. W. Bruhn, Crescent Lake, paid a \$25 fine for disorderly conduct.

Both were said by Hills officers to be very drunk. They had in their car alcoholic liquor, which Bruhn dumped when police approached, officers say.

Miller and Harrison, of Lake Angelus, were arraigned before Justice Floyd S. Buck Tuesday morning for disorderly conduct, under the Woodward Hills statute, as the result of an accident Sunday on Woodward avenue near the Long Lake road. Miller paid a \$50 and Harrison a \$25 fine.

Miller, driving north on Woodward avenue, crashed his car into the one ahead, belonging to and driven by Harold H. Smiley, 1326 Dime Bank Building, Detroit. No one was injured, but Hills officers who investigated placed the blame of the accident on Miller and his companion, who, they said, were very drunk.

OAKLAND COUNTY NEWS

Onkland County chapters of the American Legion on Labor Day celebrated in Farmington with elaborate ceremonies its annual "Gala Day." Both sides lined the town hall park and the streets were decorated for the event.

A program of games and athletic contests was held. The athletic field was dedicated in the morning, the feature event being a parade and the unfurling of the flag.

Four automobile accidents in which the damaged cars were piled up at different places along the Eastern Michigan Railroad tracks in Royal Oak on Tuesday, delayed the interurban service for more than an hour.

The four wrecks which in each a short time necessitated the use of all available wrecking crews in the district. One of the accidents, in which Hans Olson, of Birmingham, miraculously escaped death when his automobile was struck and demolished by a south-bound interurban, is recorded on page one of this issue of the Eccentric.

At the Thirteen-Mile road an automobile driven by Chester Clossen, of Royal Oak, was struck and overturned after striking the rear end of a truck. William A. Kirby of Ferndale was driving an automobile which turned over after being forced onto the tracks to avoid a collision near the Twelve and One Half Mile roads.

The automobile, which was driven by William McGinnis of Detroit was forced onto the tracks and had been forced to avoid hitting another automobile.

Two couples, sitting in a parked automobile on Twelve-Mile road east of John R. street, Royal Oak township, were held up by three armed bandits, at 9:30 a. m. Monday. The bandits escaped in an automobile which turned over after they had taken from the two youths and a spare tire from the parked machine.

Deputy sheriffs from Royal Oak and Hazel Park are investigating the holdup.

Three slot machines were confiscated Saturday night by Berkeley police. Two of the machines were taken from Northwest Inn and the third from a confectionery on Woodward avenue.

Chief of Police Frank Irons stated today that such machines are operated in violation of the law, and others will be confiscated if they are brought into the village.
