

JORDAN OPENS AUTO AGENCY

Chevrolet Sales in Birmingham Has In Taken Over By Detroit

Equipped with the most modern facilities for servicing automobiles and entirely remodelled and enlarged, the new J. D. Jordan Chevrolet Sales agency, formerly the Gehring Chevrolet Sales on South Woodward avenue, was formally opened to the public on Tuesday.

New tool equipment and a complete stock of Chevrolet parts have been installed in the new sales and service agency and the repair and maintenance work in this establishment will be conducted by factory-trained men under the direction of a service manager who has had broad experience in the automobile service and maintenance work.

Some J. D. Jordan, who has been engaged in the automobile business for more than 20 years, formerly was a member of the Tucker-Jordan Chevrolet Sales, Inc., in Detroit at Mack and Lakewood avenues. He plans to establish his permanent residence in Birmingham, he says.

Some of the features Mr. Jordan plans to inaugurate in Birmingham are chauffeur service for the convenience of patrons who wish to leave their automobiles in the service department; this service will be offered for those who wish to be driven to their homes after leaving their machines for servicing. Mr. Jordan also announces that a night service will be offered for Birmingham residents whose businesses are in Detroit. Two quarts of oil will be given away free to all Chevrolet owners in the Birmingham district whose cars are serviced during the next two weeks at his establishment, Mr. Jordan says.
