

WAR ON FRUIT THIEVES BEGUN

Three Youths Arrested For Stealing From Hills Orchards

Four boys, the youngest, 16 years old, and the others 17 and 19 years old, were apprehended Saturday by Sgt. Delos Anderson, of the Bloomfield Hills Police department, in Trowbridge Farms picking apples and loading them into their automobile. When Sgt. Anderson found them, they had already filled one bushel basket.

The 16-year-old boy was released with a reprimand. The others were brought before Justice Floyd S. Buck and told to pay fines of \$15 each or spend 10 days in the Oakland County jail. They were committed to jail. The boys are Sam Guzzino, 17, of 9642 East Vernor Highway, Frank Howe, 19, of 2435 Joseph Campau and Lester Gieson, 19, of 2407 Mt. Elliott street, all of Detroit.

"We have been finding even more trouble than usual this summer with fruit stealers," William G. Rutman, chief of Bloomfield Hills police, said. "We decided at first to take their loot away from them and let them go, but we have found that policy unwise."

"Last week we found four young boys who had picked four bushel baskets of plums. We scolded them and sent them away returning the plums to the owner. A short time later, we found the same boys back in the same orchard. Because they were minors we did not prosecute. In the future, all fruit stealers will be severely dealt with."

FROM TEE TO GREEN

As golf goes on in its many theories we hesitate to define just what is meant by style and form, when we see so many unorthodox players getting so successful.

We do not select Willie Hunter, as great a player as Jones ever



not, as an example, but we do marvel at his stroke of the tee where every ounce of power is in the shot.

Hunter is a stylist in every sense of the word, where the arms and shoulders are involved, but is unorthodox in use of hips and legs.

The majority of great players stand with the weight evenly distributed and the shifting is done at the start of the swing. Hunter works the hip action more like Haggen except with more prominence.

This action puts more power in the stroke, but must conse-

quently be well timed and especially when getting into the drive. Note in the illustration of Hunter the stress that is put upon that very stiff left arm, also how the right shoulder is ready for the power in the contact.

In timing the pivot, Hunter brings his right shoulder far back at the top of the backswing with his hands well out or above his head.

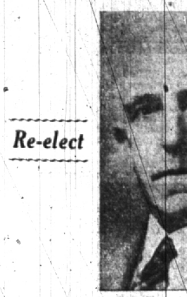

"The County mortgage idea recently proposed would be expensive and directly contrary to the economy warning to County officials last Friday by the Oakland County Bankers' Association," says Garnet M. Sparks, corner candidate. He also declares that "I believe the people of Oakland County agree with me that 28 years in office, which one of the present coroners has had, is enough." Mr. Sparks is one of the leading candidates for coroner on the Republican ticket, at the primary September 9.

"Every taxpayer will agree with the opinion expressed last week by Oakland County's leading bankers, that the County must cut expenditures to the very minimum to halt increases in taxation," says Mr. Sparks. "The County does not need a mortgage if it elects as coroners, men who are sufficiently equipped to take care of the needs of the office. Building a mortgage would probably cost at least \$50,000, and three additional salaries on the County payroll for maintenance. There are enough regularly-maintained ambulances in the County now to handle the work, if it is properly organized."

"Another way in which economy can be achieved in the Coroner's office is to hold no unnecessary inquests. I would cut them to the absolute minimum. Still another means of economy and efficiency would be to secure the co-operation of local justices of the peace to act for the coroner in their own communities, thereby reducing mileage costs and delays of long trips to and from various parts of the County. Local officials and morticians are competent and can often be the most helpful to the families involved when a situation arises in which the coroner is needed."

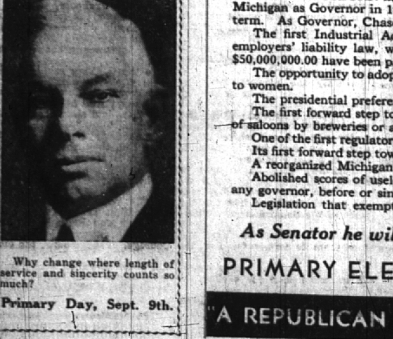

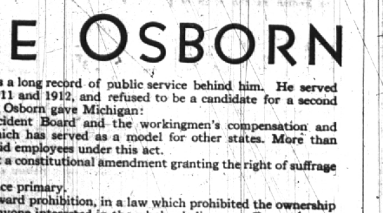
