CHURCH TO HOLD UNIFIED SERVICE


A project of statewide interest to churches and religious educators will be conducted for the next six months, beginning this Sunday morning at 10 o'clock, at the first Baptist Church of Birmingham.

The project consists of a new plan for the Sunday morning church and Sunday School services, and is called "The United Service of Worship and Study," and is an attempt to bridge the chasm between the Sunday school and the Sunday morning church service by combining the essential parts of the two separate services in a single "Unified Service" of much shorter duration.

The worship period will be held in the church auditorium and will be conducted by the pastor, Rev. David Leon Woodward, in cooperation with a committee composed of two of the superintendents, David Anderson and J. H. Wallace.

The United Service calls for a period of worship—about 35 minutes; the period for the inspirational message or sermon—about 15 or 20 minutes; the period for the classes of study—about 30 or 40 minutes. During the spring and summer months the United Service will begin promptly at 10 a. m. Parents may bring their babies and little children and leave them at the church, while they exercise their privilege of worship and study.

Or the gardener who wants old friends and familiar faces about him, can find flower catalogs with the coming of spring by planting old favorites.

Some gardeners like to cultivate flowers for cutting to brighten the corners of home. Not only their homes, but those of their friends, too, for lack of space, time or energy are unable to produce successful blooms.

For those to whom garden means chiefly flowers for gifts or decoration, the money must have a strong appeal. The money has all the requisites of a decorative medium. These flowers have long stems and can be used in tall vases and large bowls; the blossoms are large and showy, and the colors both dainty and brilliant.

One always associates roses with June, and the rose is among those old flower friends that the sentimentalist gardener welcomes from year to year.

With the peony and rose, go also iris, delphinium, St. David's, geranium and hardy chrysanthemum among the perennials, which are best adapted to cutting. From the annuals one may call a bouquet of lovely pastel tints composed of sweet peas, and pink, higonette, blue-eyed daisy, Shirley poppies, delicate in their coloring, larkspur and pansies, higonette, pansies and nasturtiums, with scores of others of both familiar and unfamiliar names.


