

TOWNSHIP WILL BORROW \$60,000

Loth Cashed by School District Obligations

A loan of \$60,000 to be made by the Bloomfield Township against delinquent taxes for 1931, authorized by the Township Board in a resolution adopted at a meeting held in the Municipal Building Monday evening.

Although the resolution authorizing borrowing \$60,000, negotiations for which are now under way, the township will ask for only half that amount for immediate use, James Y. Bayley, township clerk explained.

As the township is in need of \$30,000 for immediate use, this amount, if the loan is secured, will be paid by Aug. 15, for which the township will give three notes to mature Feb. 15, 1932.

The remainder of the loan, the resolution provides, can be drawn upon from time to time as funds are needed by the township. The present need of the township is to cover nearly all rural School District obligations against delinquent taxes, Parry A. Vaughan, supervisor, said.
