

6 ARRESTED ON DRY CHARGES

Bloomfield Hills Week-End Offenders Include 3 Drunk Drivers

Six persons charged with violation of the prohibition laws, including three drunk drivers, all of whom were arrested by Bloomfield Hills police on the week-end, were fined or given jail sentences when arraigned before Justice Floyd S. Buck Monday morning.

James McKibben, 5928 14th street, Detroit, who police claim threw a bottle of liquor out of the car when arrested, was sentenced to 60 days in jail in default of a \$100 fine on a drunk driving charge.

Russell Gates, 6524 Venice street, Detroit, and Gustav Yeltinghouse, Frankmouth, Michigan, both had liquor in their possession, police said, and both paid fines on charges of drunk driving.

Three other men, all charged with being drunk and disorderly, paid fines of \$20 each rather than spend 15 days in jail. They were: Clarence Kasanoff, 5444 Chicago street, Detroit; Harry Terrill, Midland, Mich.; and Edwin Hecht, Frankmouth.

Moved by Potter seconded by McKinney that John E. Maritz serve on the Birmingham Scholarship Fund Association for 1931-1932. Carried.

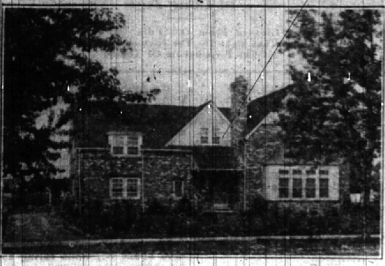
Moved by Maritz supported by Potter that Ray A. Palmer serve on the Board of Trustees for the Birmingham Community House for 1931-1932. Carried.

FIREMEN ANSWER 31 CALLS IN JULY

Grass Fires Keep Smoke-Eaters Busy; Damage Totals \$203.50

Birmingham firemen answered 31 calls, nearly all of which were to grass fires, during the month of July, according to the department's monthly report.

A total of \$203.50 damage was caused by the blazes, \$25 of which was to buildings and \$178.50 to contents. Property valued at \$13,000 was endangered.

Firemen put in 12 hours and 24 minutes of actual fire fighting, 785 gallons of water with the booster pump, and one quart of chemicals. Fire trucks travelled 74.7 miles to and from the fires.

Eight persons paid fines for traffic violations over the week-end; seven in police traffic court and one before Judge Arthur J. Tuggey.

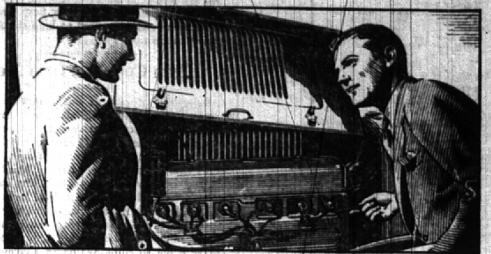

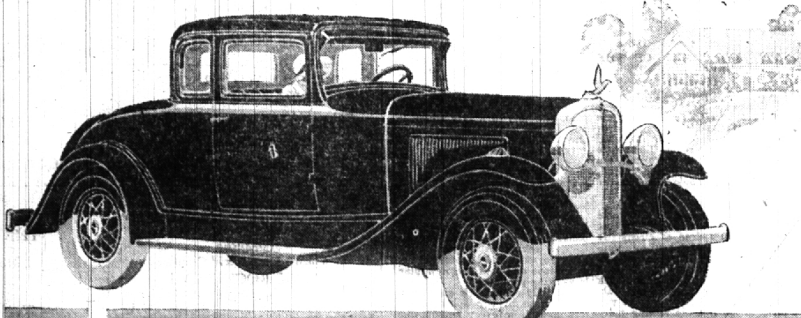
