**General Requirements.**

(b) The general requirements of this Section shall apply to both Class A and Class B sprinkler systems unless specifically noted otherwise.

**Class A Systems Required.**

1—Where sprinkler systems are required in the stage portion of theatres, in warehouses, stores of over 8,000 square feet in area, Class 4 B occupancies and other occupancies not included in those where Class B sprinkler systems are permitted, such sprinkler systems shall be Class A systems.

**Class B System Permitted.**

2—Class B systems shall be permitted only in buildings housing one or more of the following or similar lesser hazardous occupancies.

**Spacing of Sprinkler Heads.**

3—The spacing of sprinkler heads as given in the table shall be the maximum spacing and such spacing shall be limited by the area each sprinkler can adequately protect considering the arrangement of partitions and other construction.

**Main Supply Pipes.**

4—The main supply pipe to 2 or more 2½ inch risers shall be not less than 4 inch pipe.

**Water Supply.**

5—Every sprinkler system shall be provided with a Siamese connection on a street face near the first floor level. Such Siamese connection shall conform to the requirements of Section 13.101 (h). The Siamese fire department connection shall be in addition to one or more of the sources of water supply as listed in the table.

**Materials.**

6—All pipe and valves shall be of adequate strength to safely resist the maximum working pressures. Sprinkler heads shall be of an approved type.

**Tests.**

7—After installation, all sprinkler systems shall be tested for tightness, strength and proper operation in the presence of the Building Inspector.

**Dry Systems.**

8—Sprinkler systems shall be wet systems, except where the nature of the occupancy is such that a wet system is impractical, as in rooms which cannot be properly heated, in which cases a dry system may be permitted.

**Maintenance.**

9—All sprinkler systems shall be maintained in perfect working condition at all times by the owner or occupant of the building.
