Royal Oak Holds Maples To Scoreless Deadlock In Annual Gridiron Fray

4,000 See Baldwin Team Strike Often At Acorn Goal Line, But Fail To Score; Frozen Field Hampers Runners

With Birmingham a strong favorite to win the annual Baldwin-Royal Oak High School Thanksgiving Day football "classic," the Acorns drove home a moral victory when they succeeded in holding the Maples to a scoreless tie on Cass Field, in Royal Oak, last Thursday morning.

The game was the third in the first scoreless contest played in the history of gridiron meetings between the two schools. Of the 15 games played, Birmingham has won seven and Royal Oak three. Nearly 4,000 spectators witnessed the contest, the net proceeds of which were turned over to the Emergency Relief Fund of the

Rochelleau and Captain Harris were the outstanding offensive players on the Maple squad, with Miller's fine work at tackle, Shepherd's defensive work on passes and Bunyan's sure-footed tackling in the open, standing out in the defensive playing. Neiger of the Royal Oak squad, was the most troublesome to the Birmingham gridlers, with Cameron, Hill, Wilbur and J. Mathews also sharing the limelight for spectacular work against the Maples.

The six players, all of whom figured prominently in their team's successful season which closed two weeks ago, are George Otis, left end; Leigh Lynch, left guard; Tom Bryant, center; Gordon LeFebvre, right end; Henry Rauch, left halfback; and Tom Raymond, right halfback.

Three of the remaining positions on the team were given to County Day School players and two to members of the Detroit University School team.

Both are good on defense and keep plays inside them. This gives the tackles opportunities to stop the offense. Both can snap passes and are fast going down under punts.

"For guards I am taking two boys who are really tackles, but who have every quality necessary to fill the inside positions. My selections are Leigh Lynch, of Cranbrook, and Howard Crawford, of County Day. They are heavy and aggressive, use their hands well on defense and tackle hard.
