FIVE INJURED IN CAR CRASH HILLS POLICE JAIL THIEVES

72-Year-Old Man, 4-Year-Old Girl Among Group Caught in Gravel Pit, One Gets 20 Days, Other Given Probation

Five persons, among whom were a 72-year-old man and a four-year-old girl, were injured in an automobile accident at Woodward avenue and the Lone Pine road, Saturday morning. The injured were treated at the office of Dr. A. H. Gordon. I. J. Hiller, 72 years old, an undertaker of 512 East Midland street, Bay City, the driver of one of the machines, received severe cuts on the forehead. Allen Mackinon, 65, of 307 East Fisher street, Bay City, also received head injuries and bruises; Mrs. Florence McKay, 45 years old, 405 West Warner avenue, Bay City, suffered injuries to her nose, left arm and left leg, and Mrs. Minnie Richter, 44 years old, also of Bay City, was cut and bruised. The four-year-old girl, Mary Wilson, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. A. B. Wilson, 501 East 4th street, Flint, was cut about the mouth. She was riding in the other car which was being driven by her father. According to the police report, Hiller failed to notice that Wilson had stopped for the signal light at the intersection and crashed into Wilson's machine. Both cars were badly damaged. The injured were taken to the doctors' office by Sgt. DeLoe Anderson and George C. Booth. Two Pontiac men arrested Saturday evening by Bloomfield Hills police after they had been caught stealing material from the Floyd Beardslee gravel pit on Square Lake road in Bloomfield Hills, pleaded guilty Monday morning when arraigned before Justice Floyd S. Buck on charges of simple larceny. Arley Nelson, 28 years old, 185 Russell street, Pontiac, was released on six months probation to Chief William Patman and his companion, Geoffrey Carlsten, 23, 269 Clifford street, Pontiac, was sentenced to 20 days in the Oakland County Jail. The court was lenient to Nelson because his wife is a cripple and Nelson has been out of work for some time. According to Patrolmen Elmer Seibert and Tom Banks, who made the arrest, they first noticed a suspicious automobile parked near the gravel pit street, Flint, was cut about the mouth. She was riding in the other car which was being driven by her father. On Saturday night the two officers again saw the car and questioned the men who were found to have 400 feet of insulated copper wire in their possession and could not give a satisfactory explanation for its possession, they reported.

Tuesday night more than 150 village boys between 9 and 21 are expected as guests of the DeMolay organization in Masonic Temple at 8 p. m. to hear Capt. Alfred Nyczowski of Detroit relate his thrilling experience on the coast of the Kromping Wilhelm. Musical entertainment and a lunch are also on the program, all without charge to the boys. Invitations to all members of the five Boy Scout troops of the village to attend en masse with their leaders, have been accepted. All other boys in the village between 11 and 21 years of age are invited.

Second in command on the Kromping Wilhelm during the World War, the Count was on the Atlantic without sight of land for 25 days. 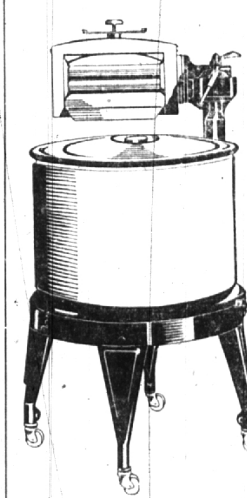

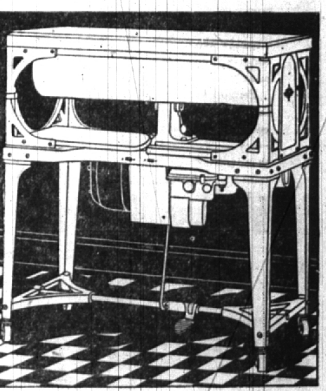
